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Career Tech Writers Studio Students Draft Success as Finalists in Young Playwrights Festival

TRAVERSE CITY, Mich. — Students enrolled in the Career Tech Writers Studio program put their developing skills to good use in the 13th annual Young Playwrights Festival. Festival coordinators recently announced six area high school students selected as finalists in the playwrights competition. Of the six, five of the finalists are students in Writers Studio, one of <u>22</u> programs operated by Northwest Education Services (North Ed) Career Tech.

The Young Playwrights Festival is an annual competition that requires students to write and submit an original one-act play to a panel of judges. Of the plays submitted in December 2023, 12 were selected as semifinalists. The six finalists will be paired with national theater mentors who coach them on fine-tuning their plays and script-writing skills. They also win \$100 and get to see their plays performed on stage at the City Opera House at 1:30 p.m on April 14.

During the two-year coursework, high school juniors and seniors learn to write in various creative and professional writing genres, providing a foundation for strong communications skills and extensive opportunities in college and career. Students are instructed by published poet and essayist Teresa Scollon.
